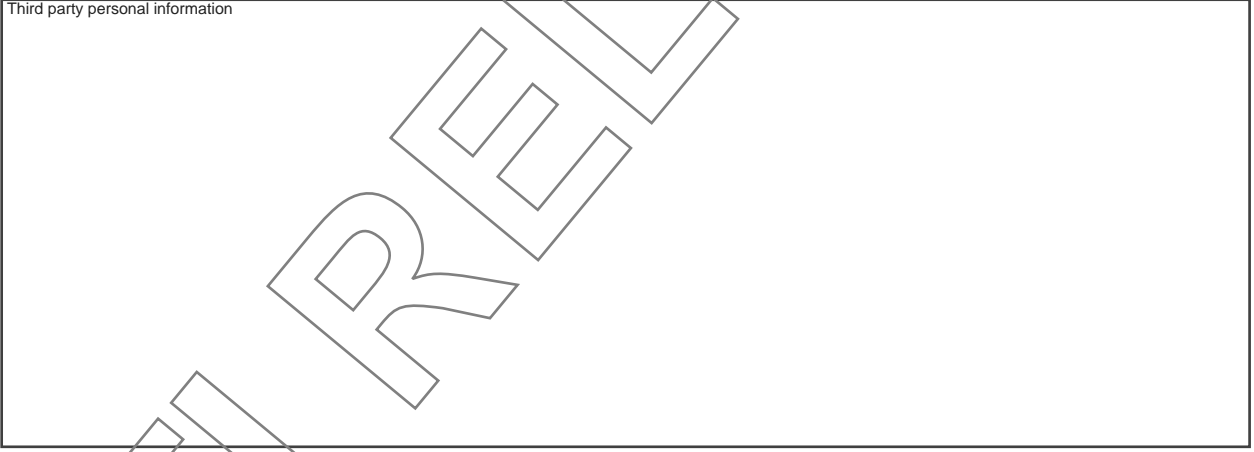

MEMORANDUMComplaint re Wilson Hospital.

[Third party personal information] Windsor, again called at this office today to complain of the conduct of the boys at the Wilson Hospital

[redacted] at times the language of some of the boys is most obscene, [redacted]

[redacted] garden [redacted] had been completely ruined by the frequent advent of boys from the Home seeking to recover cricket balls, tennis balls, etc., [redacted]

The latest complaint [redacted] was in relation to the throwing of stones. On one recent occasion a stone throwing episode occurred at 9.30 p.m. Stones were thrown on the iron roofs of the Recreation and Manual Training Building at the rear of the Hospital, and during the evening of 13th September [redacted]

[redacted] peace and security are threatened by the proximity of the home in view of the conduct of the boys and [redacted] wishes some definite action taken to remedy the position.

I advised [redacted] complaints would be carefully noted and would be brought to the notice of the Under Secretary, and undoubtedly, an investigation would be made.
