

So more than half of YP sentenced in table 36 were required to serve more time in detention post sentence.

This would have to depend on a variety of factors, e.g the nature of the charges, more complex charges take longer to resolve, how quickly parties can proceed to sentence which will depend on factors outside of the Govt's control.

Table 37 we can say our reforms naturally will result in more children being refused bail and held on remand.
